MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

I. Genuinely Worship God Through Our Encounter Worship Service

- A. We Must Be Genuine and Sincere When We Worship God**
“...true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth.” (Jn. 4:23b-24)
- B. We Must Be Holy, Presenting Our Bodies as Living Sacrifices to God**
“...offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship.” (Rom. 12:1)
- C. We Must Be in Right Relationship with Others**
“...if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift.” (Matt. 5:23-24)

II. Stay in Fellowship with Other Believers Through an iCom Groups

- A. We Invite God’s Presence When We Fellowship Together**
“The Lord Jesus said, “For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them.” (Matt. 18:20).
- B. We Need Spiritual Encouragement To Finish Strong**
“Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.” (Heb. 10:25).
- C. We Help One Another in Time of Need**
“They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need.” (Acts 2:42-45)

III. Humbly Serve the Lord

- A. We Are All Part of the Priesthood of Believers to Testify of God’s Work in Our Lives**
“But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.” (1 Pet. 2:9)
- B. God Blesses the Church With People Who Have Different Spiritual Gifts (Romans 12:3b-8)**
“Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you. Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have

different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully. (Rom. 12:3b-8)

C. We Are to Use Our Gifts to Serve Others

Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms. (1 Pet. 4:10)

IV. Give Cheerfully to the Lord's Work

A. Giving Reveals Where One's Heart Is

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matt. 6:21)

B. Giving Recognizes that Everything Comes From God

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand." (1 Ch 29:14)

C. Not Giving is Robbing From God

"Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me. "But you ask, 'How do we rob you?' "In tithes and offerings." (Mal 3:8)

D. Through Disciplined and Cheerful Giving, We Experience God's Abundance & Fruitfulness

"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." (2 Cor 9:6-8)

E. We Should Give According to the Proportion of Our Income

"On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income." (1 Cor. 16:2)

V. Make Every Effort to Stay United

A. Our Unity Affects Our Witness for the Lord

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." (Jn 17:20-23)

C. Being a Christian Supercedes Our Cultural Background

"Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called 'uncircumcised' by those who call themselves 'the circumcision' (that done in the body by the hands of men)—remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship

in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility.” (Eph 2:11-16)

D. Our Oneness Supercedes Culture, Gender, and Socio-Economic Status

“You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.” (Gal. 3:26-28)

E. Living a Life Worthy of Our Calling Requires a Pursuit of Oneness

“I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.” (Eph 4:1-3)
